A network of Environmental Awareness Representatives,

help to filter and disseminate information & highlight problem areas. Several events have been held covering all campaign topics with stalls from local and national organisations. Measuring success of the campaign is undertaken by obtaining regular estimates of the individual electricity and water usage for main renal unit and satellite units, and monitoring paper usage.

 Our 'two fingered' approach to energy reduction (Turning off lights and computers when leaving an office)

 Investment in double sided printers & monitoring of paper usage.

 Reuse of R.O. water.

 Centralised dialysate for haemodialysis units.

 Heat exchangers on the haemodialysis machines

 Stop the use of bottled drinking water.
 Pilot the use of telephone clinics having reached agreements on funding.
 Travel to work by bus maps.
 Video/teleconferencing.
 Motion sensors to reduce electric light consumption.
